Housing Investment Framework (HIF)

In 2002 the Government identified nine areas across the country that had experienced long periods of economic decline as job patterns had shifted and people had moved away to take up new opportunities. Despite being within the cities where the economy was growing these neighbourhoods remained disconnected with residents experiencing low skills levels, worklessness, high levels of crime and poor facilities.

Manchester was identified as one such pathfinder and through an innovative procurement process, supported by the Construction Centre for Innovation, the City Council developed a long term partnership approach to the delivery of regeneration projects. - **38,525m² of land has received environmental improvements** creation of open spaces, controlled parking and vehicular movement, enhanced street scaping and lighting are just some of the measures implemented by the Partnership to create inclusive home zones that are safer and secure and extend the local community's living space
- 80% of waste has been recycled As well as helping to save the environment costs savings have been made through avoidance of land fill and reduced transport costs
- 89.3% customer satisfaction averaged across projects demonstrating success in developing community confidence in the solutions provided by the Partnership

Through good physical regeneration, environmental, social and economic benefits are being realised.

- Stabilisation of the housing market is being delivered by improving the standard and management of stock within the private rented sector and raising the demand for housing by making the homes and environment more desirable
- The HIF programme is encouraging investment into the area via developers, local retailers and home buyers and is also encouraging complimentary investment to the properties by their owners
- The HIF partnership has provided for all members of the Framework and their supply chains to make positive contribution in servicing local employment needs and training initiatives and in doing so further the economic regeneration of the area
